Annie Grey McDougall was born in Trois Rivieres, July 5,1866. She was the daughter of Robert McDougall and Mary Cochrane Wilson of Trois Rivieres. Her sister married Charles Millar, of Drummondville. He was an amateur photographer. Annie G. McDougall spent much of her time with them at their home, Lord's Farm in Drummondville. She bought her camera from William Notman in 1888 and received instructions in camera and dark room techniques at Notman's Bleury Street Studio. She was an amateur photographer taking photographs mainly in the Drummondville and Pierreville districts. She was a librarian at the Fraser Institute in Montreal for many years and died in September 1952. ⊙
